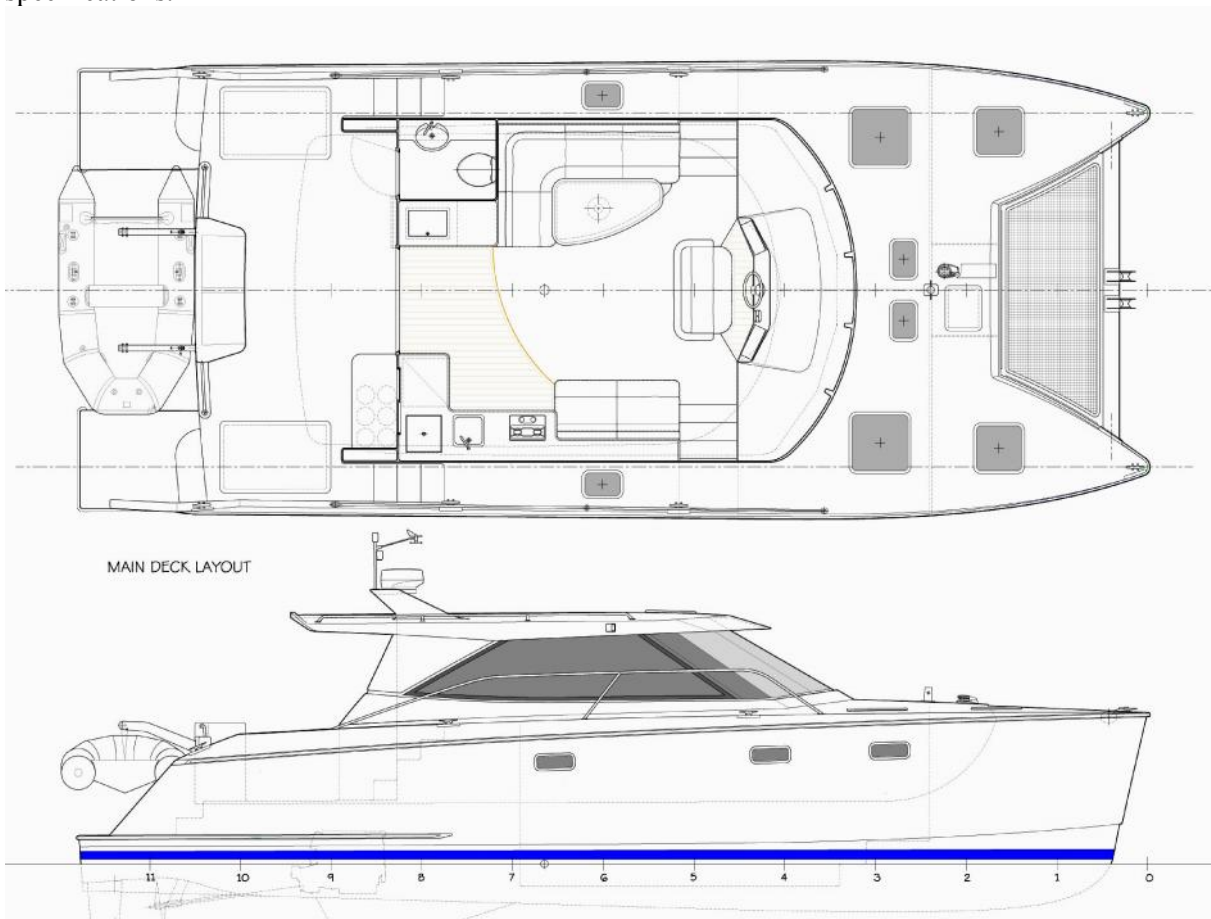
### Displacement powercats the future?

The boating summer just completed must surely have been the quietest on the water for decades, with the recession, rising fuel prices and natural disasters affecting many people. Here at Alloy Cats, the level of enquiry and sales has continued to hold, though most activity has been in the commercial sector rather than the recreational.

Of significance of late has been the interest in the Roger Hill designed 11.8m displacement powercat. This craft requires minimal engine horse power, and because it is easily pushed, is super economical. As well it creates very little wake, even when scooting along effortlessly at 20 knots.

With a pair of 125hp diesels on shafts a top speed of around 23 to 25 knots can be expected (subject to loadings). Four stroke outboards are also an option.

We have priced inboard versions from \$399,000 and outboards from \$350,000, depending on specifications.



### **Under construction right now we have:**

1. A 10m Naiad rescue boat for the Whakatane Coastguard
2. A 10.5m Naiad superyacht tender for a European owner
3. A Kingfisher 900 powercat
4. A Kingfisher 1000 powercat
5. Ongoing Kingfisher 430s, 475s and 575 trailerboats.

## **Kingfisher Boats to Samoa**

Kingfisher boats will be well represented in the forthcoming Samoa International Gamefishing contest with a probable six boats lining up for the start this May. One boat THE RODFATHER, a 8.75m trailered monohull from Te Puke, has taken advantage of a shipping line's sponsorship and is on its way to the Pacific nation and will spend a couple of months over there before returning. Already, one other local Kingfisher, a 705 model from Hamilton, is planning to ship over for the 2012 contest. At about \$3500 return, the concept is fast gaining interest, with owners keen to use their own boats, tackle and fishing ideas to explore some of the most productive game fishing waters on the planet.
